Reading and speaking

Fäeag Rotuam

Fäeag Rotuam ta (The Rotuman Language) has five basic vowels: **A E I O U**.

These basic vowels have similar pronunciation to other Pacific Languages including Te Reo Māori.

There are also five variations to these vowels: **Ä Å Ā Ō Ū**. There are slightly different ways of pronouncing the vowels **A, O** and **U**.

The basic vowels can be short or long with the long vowel sound indicated by a macron above the vowel. Long vowel sounds are slightly dragged out.

A, E, I, O, U Ä, Ā, Ō, Ū,

It is important to show this distinction as it affects the meaning of words.

For example:

Koko *mischievous / bad*

Kōkō *thorny / prickly*

Toto *blood*

Tōtō *to speak / utter*

These are pronounced as in English with a few differences:

The **G** is pronounced as the **NG** sound in **SING**.

The **R** is slightly **rolled**.

The **J** is pronounced like **CH** in **CHURCH** and never as **J** in **JUDGE** or **JUG**.

The **[ʔ]** **glottal stop** is the sound made in the middle of the phrase **Oh-oh** or **Uh-oh**.
