

RESPONSE TO AN OFFICIAL INFORMATION ACT REQUEST (REF: DOIA030-2023/24)

On 21 November 2023, you contacted the Ministry for Pacific Peoples (the Ministry) requesting, information relating to 'Facilities Maintenance (FM) undertaken by the Ministry'. Your request was processed under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA) as consultation was required with the responsible business unit. I have outlined your specific requests, and my responses are provided below.

- 1. Does your organisation undertake there FM work in house (ie staff employed by you) or is this contracted out?
- 2. If contracted out who holds this
- 3. Are there contracts in place and what is the current term expiry of this contract/s if there is?
- 4. What is the budgeted value -

The Ministry's Wellington office maintenance is mainly handled by the Landlord, with only minimal adhoc maintenance by the Ministry required. No specific maintenance contracts are in place for the Wellington Office. Our Regional office's maintenance is included in co-location arrangements; therefore no maintenance contracts are needed.

- 5. If no contract/s in place, are you looking at shifting, so that there is an overarching contract in place for these services in the near future.
- 6. If you have an in-house model, would you be open to talking to Citycare Property re the benefits of a contracted-out model?
- 7. Key contact withing your organisation for this work

The Ministry is likely to seek out co-location opportunities with other government agencies in the future and will not be looking to take on FM services. Should we require any FM work, the Ministry is required to consider the All of Government Facilities management services.
