

# Get free help keeping your home warm and dry

Pacific Healthy Homes is an initiative from the Ministry for Pacific Peoples that could help you keep your home warmer, drier and healthier.

#### You might be able to get help if you are:

- a Pacific person aged 45 or over
- a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident
- on a low income
- renting or living in a home you own
- living in Porirua or South Auckland
- have experienced a condition such as pneumonia, bronchiolitis, rheumatic fever, diabetes or meningitis.

#### **Pacific Healthy Homes initiative**

Pacific Healthy Homes is a new initiative led by the Ministry for Pacific Peoples. It helps Pacific peoples aged 45+ have warmer, drier and healthier homes.

Pacific Healthy Homes connects Pacific peoples in Porirua and South Auckland with local providers who can assess their homes and provide help with things like curtains, ventilation, heating, insulation or minor repairs.
