#### Fäeag Rotuam | Rotuman Language

Fäeag Rotuam ta (The Rotuman Language) has five basic vowels:

**A E I O U**. These basic vowels have the same pronunciation as other Pacific Languages and Te Reo Māori. There are also five variations to these vowels: Ä Ä Ä Ö Ü. These are slightly different ways of pronouncing the vowels A, O and U.

The basic vowels can be short or long with the long vowel sound indicated by a macron above the vowel. Long vowel sounds are slightly dragged out.

A, E, I, O, U  $\bar{A}$ ,  $\bar{E}$ ,  $\bar{I}$ ,  $\bar{O}$ ,  $\bar{U}$ ,

It is important to show this distinction as it affects the meaning of words. For example:

<b>Koko</b> (mischievous / bad)	<b>Kōkō</b> (thorny / prickly)
<b>Toto</b> (blood)	<b>Tōtō</b> (to speak / utter)

These are pronounced as in English with a few differences: The G is pronounced as the **NG** sound in SI**NG**.

The R is slightly rolled.

The J is pronounced like  $\mathbf{CH}$  in  $\mathbf{CHURCH}$  and never as  $\mathbf{J}$  in  $\mathbf{JUDGE}$  or  $\mathbf{JUG}$ .

The [] glottal stop is the sound made in the middle of the phrase Oh-oh or Uh-oh.
